About the Poll

Our Montana Pulse program conducts a series of public opinion polls several times per year. Each poll measures Montanans attitudes on elected officials, current policy proposals and a variety of other timely topics. The results of each poll are made available for free to the media and the general public, so that all Montanans can keep a pulse on important issues and the elected officials leading our state.

We surveyed 650 Montana voters on August 24th. We use a combination of traditional telephone survey and an online survey tool to interview randomly selected participants from a demographically diverse panel. Utilizing this methodology ensures we are able to reach voters that have abandoned landline telephones. The margin of sampling error for the sample is +/- 4 percentage points.

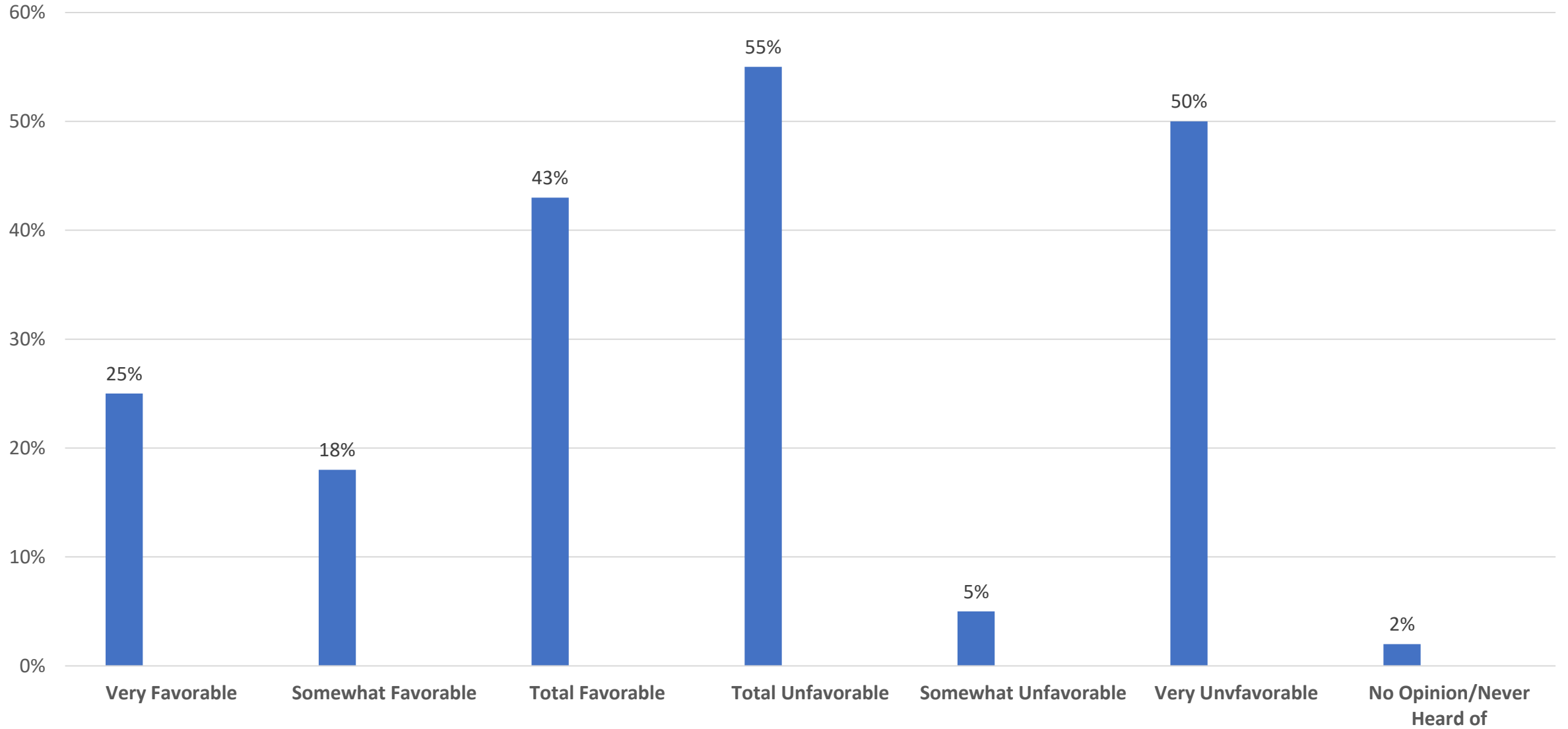

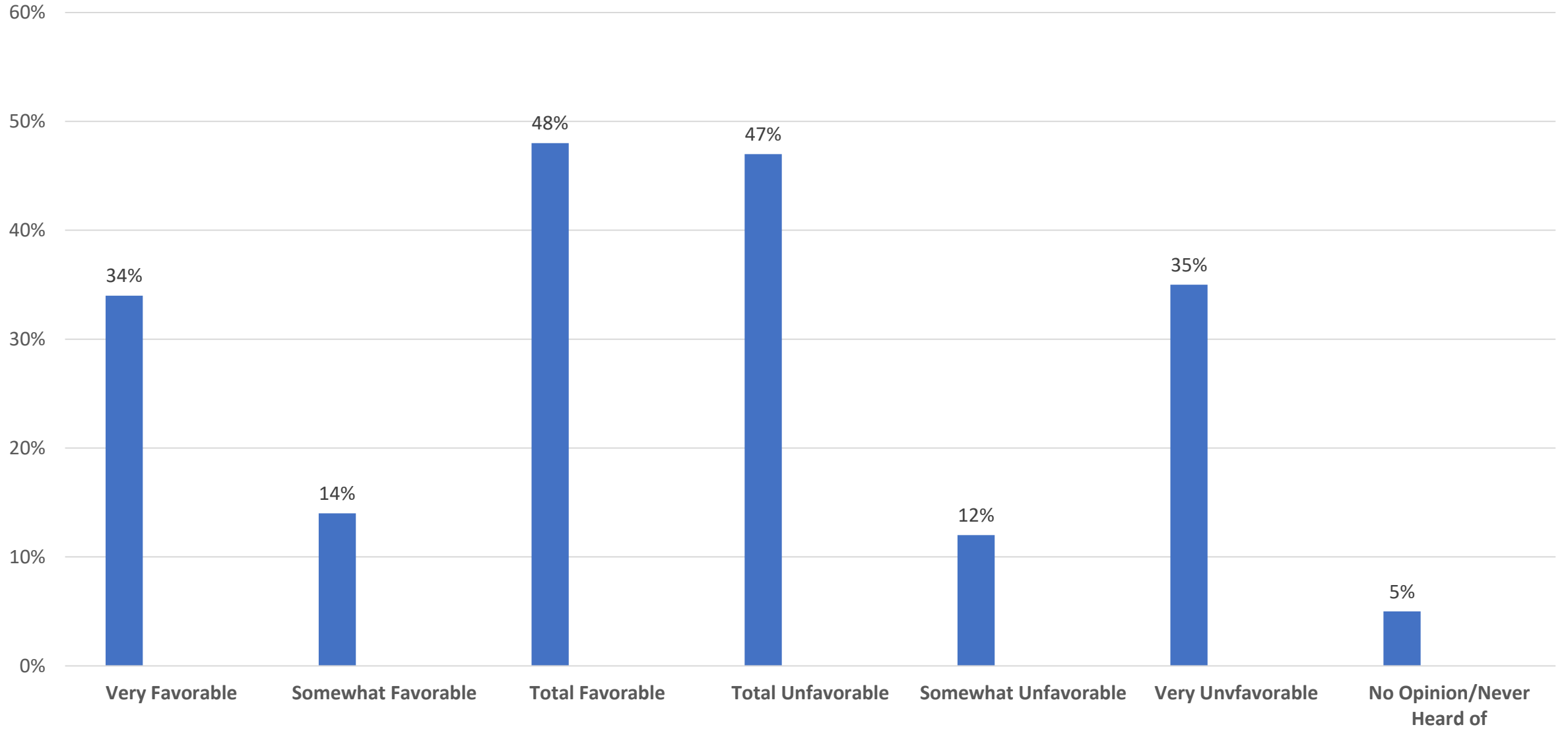

- Attorney General Austin Knudsen

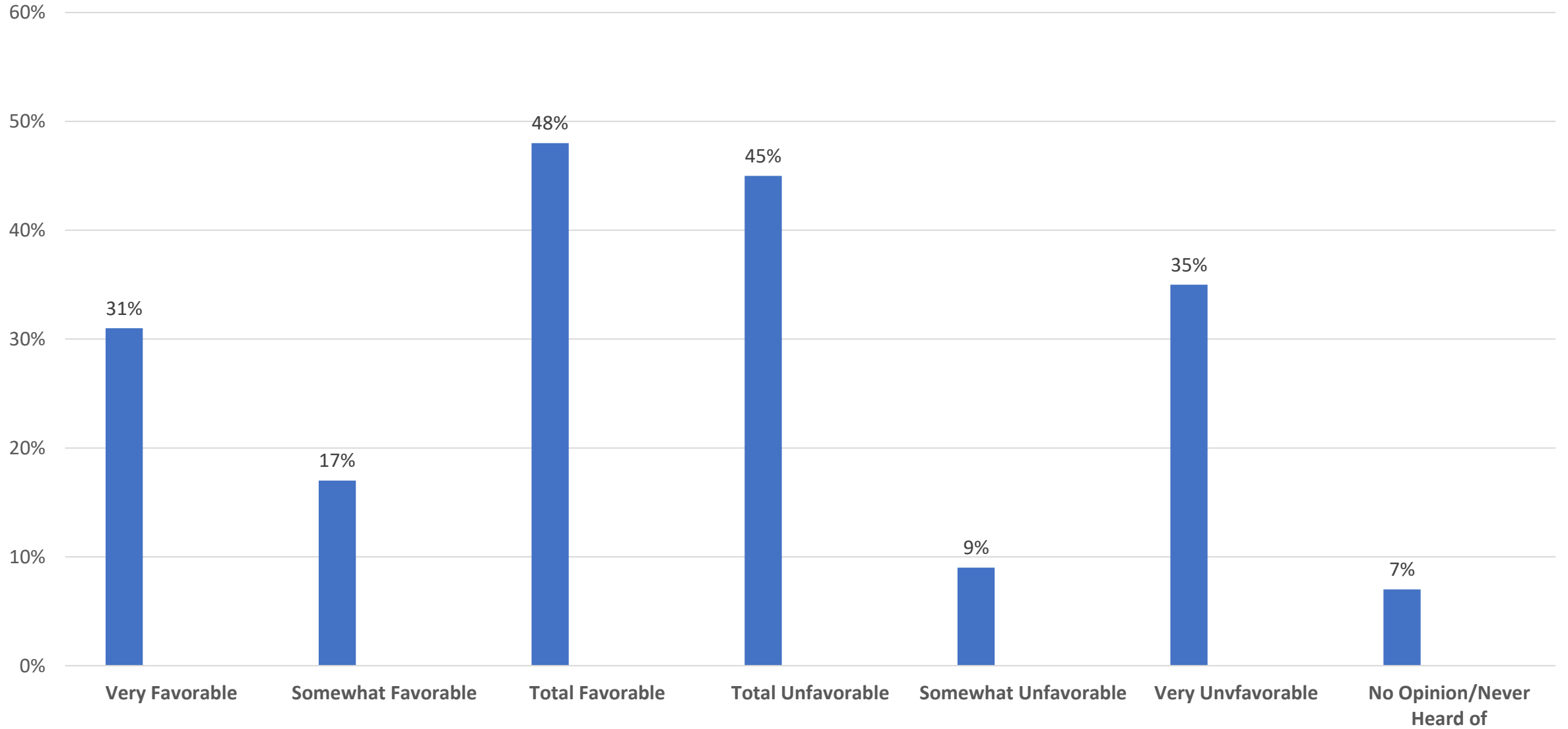
President Joe Biden Image Rating



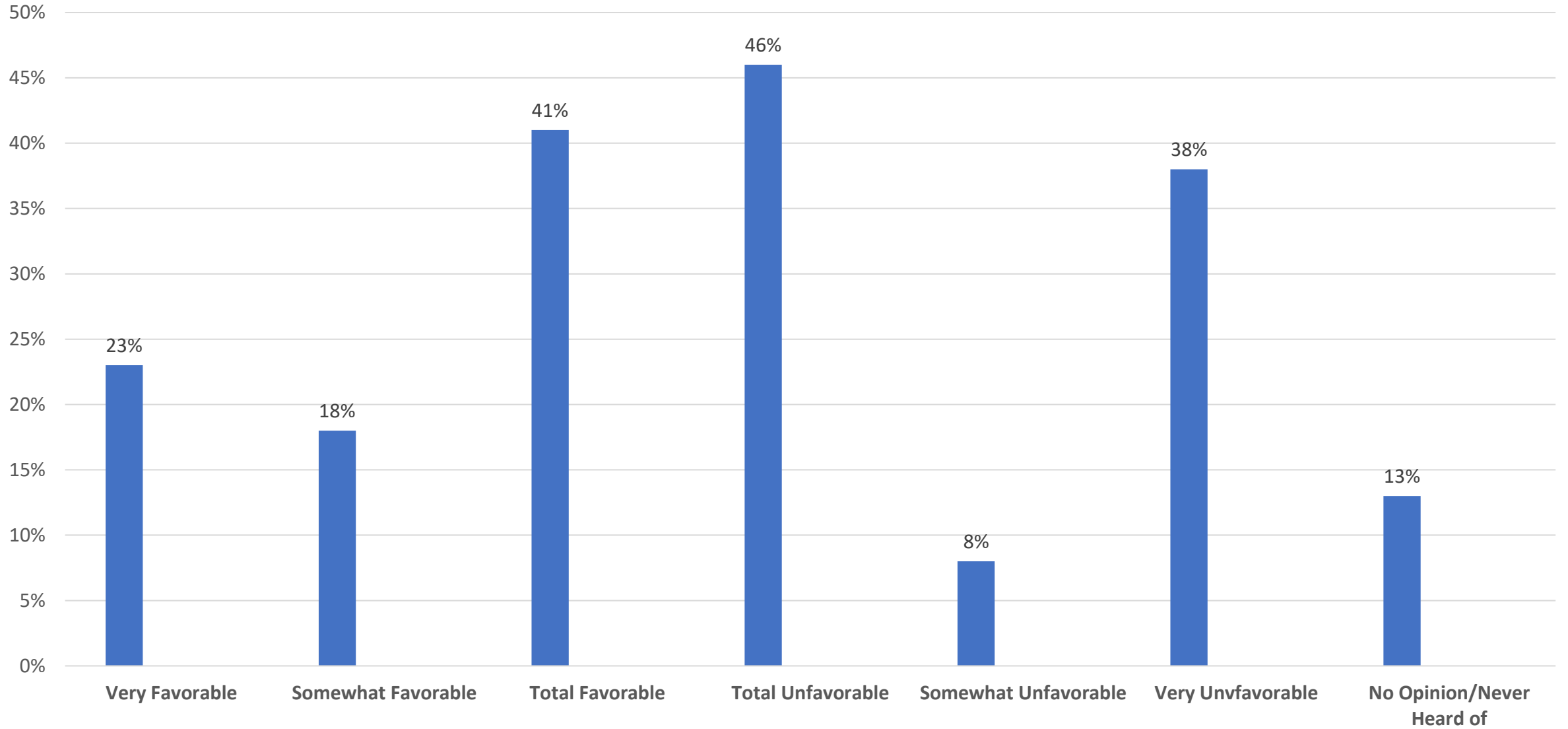
Senator Jon Tester Image Rating



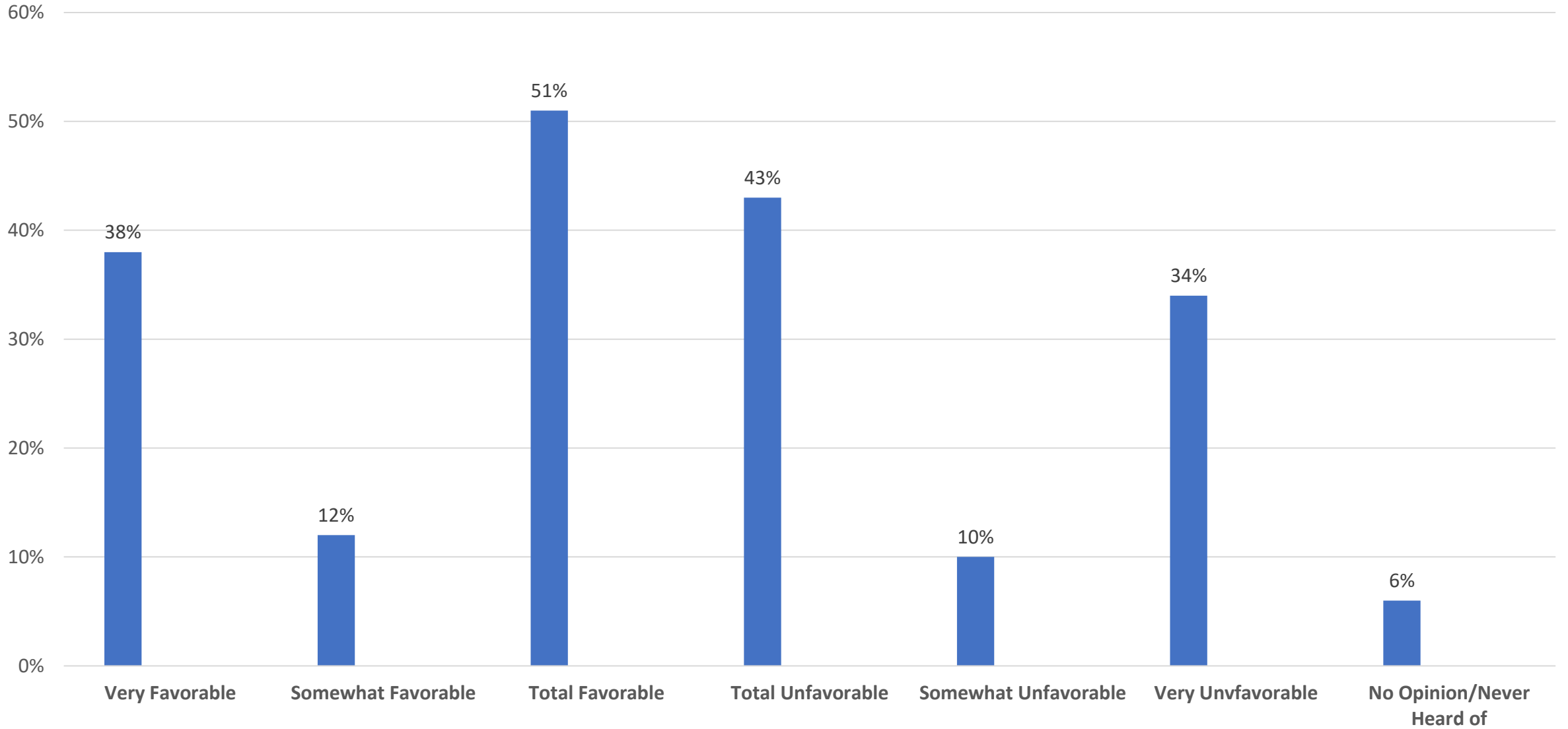
Senator Steve Daines Image Rating



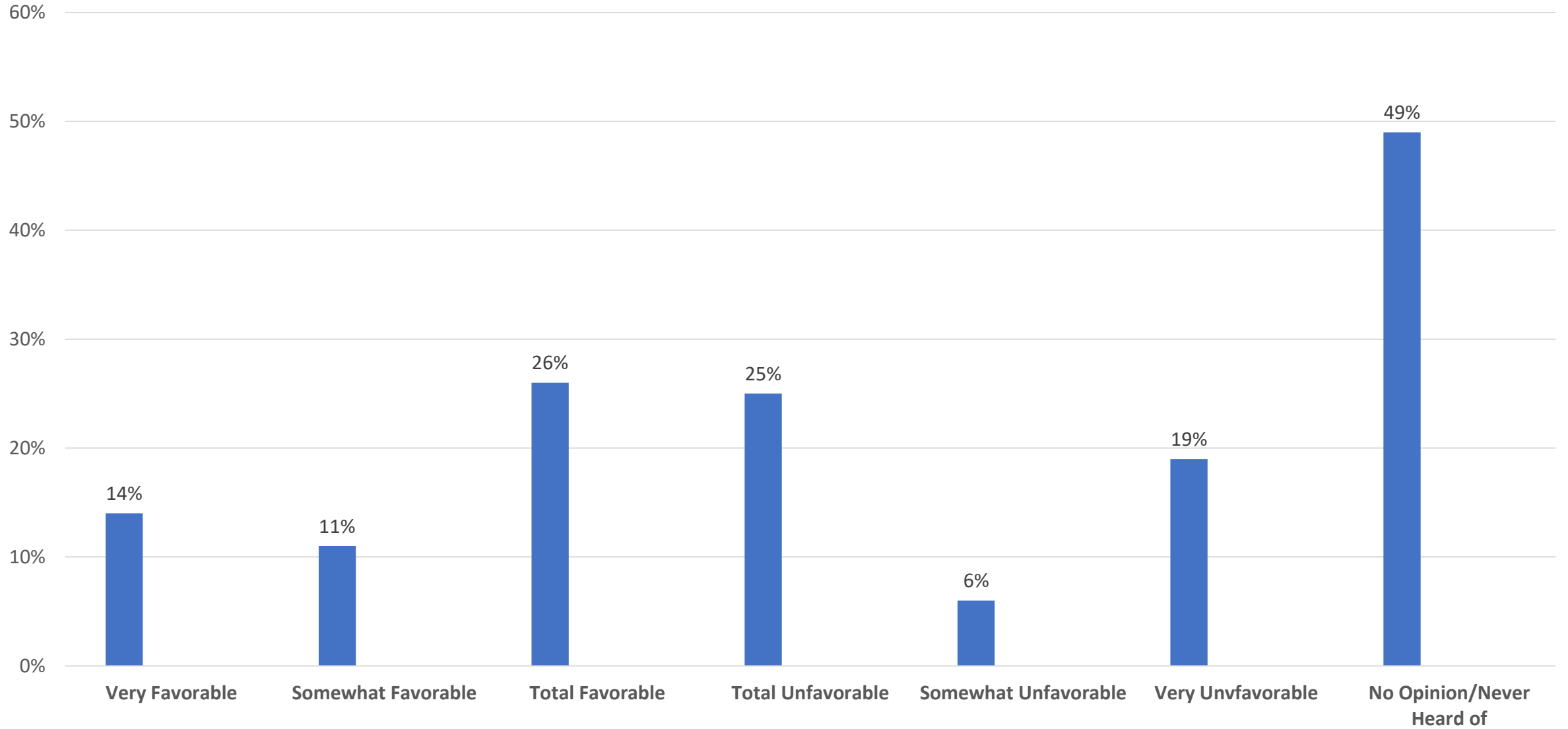
Congressman Matt Rosendale Image Rating

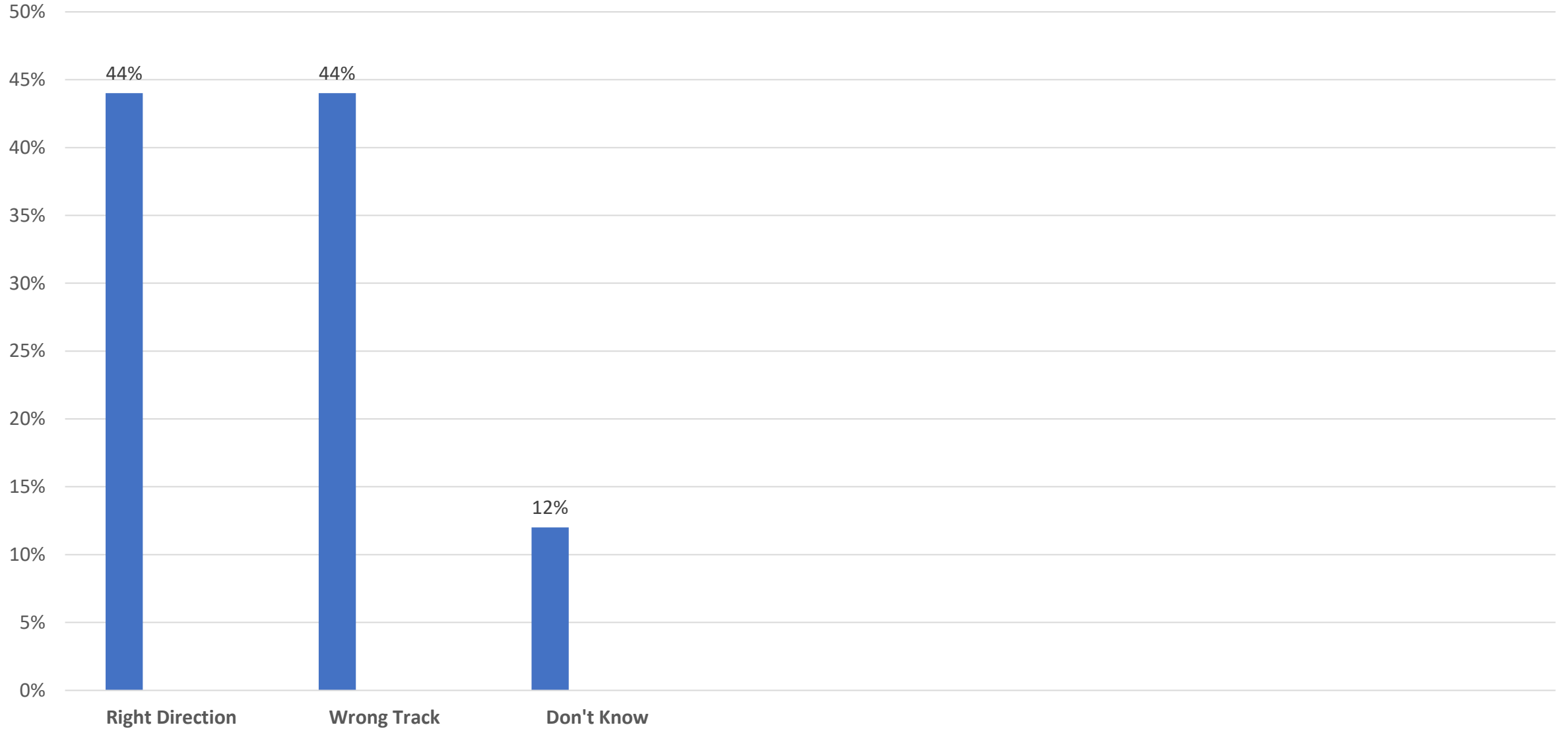


Voter Opinions of Current Issues

We asked voters their opinion on the following issues:

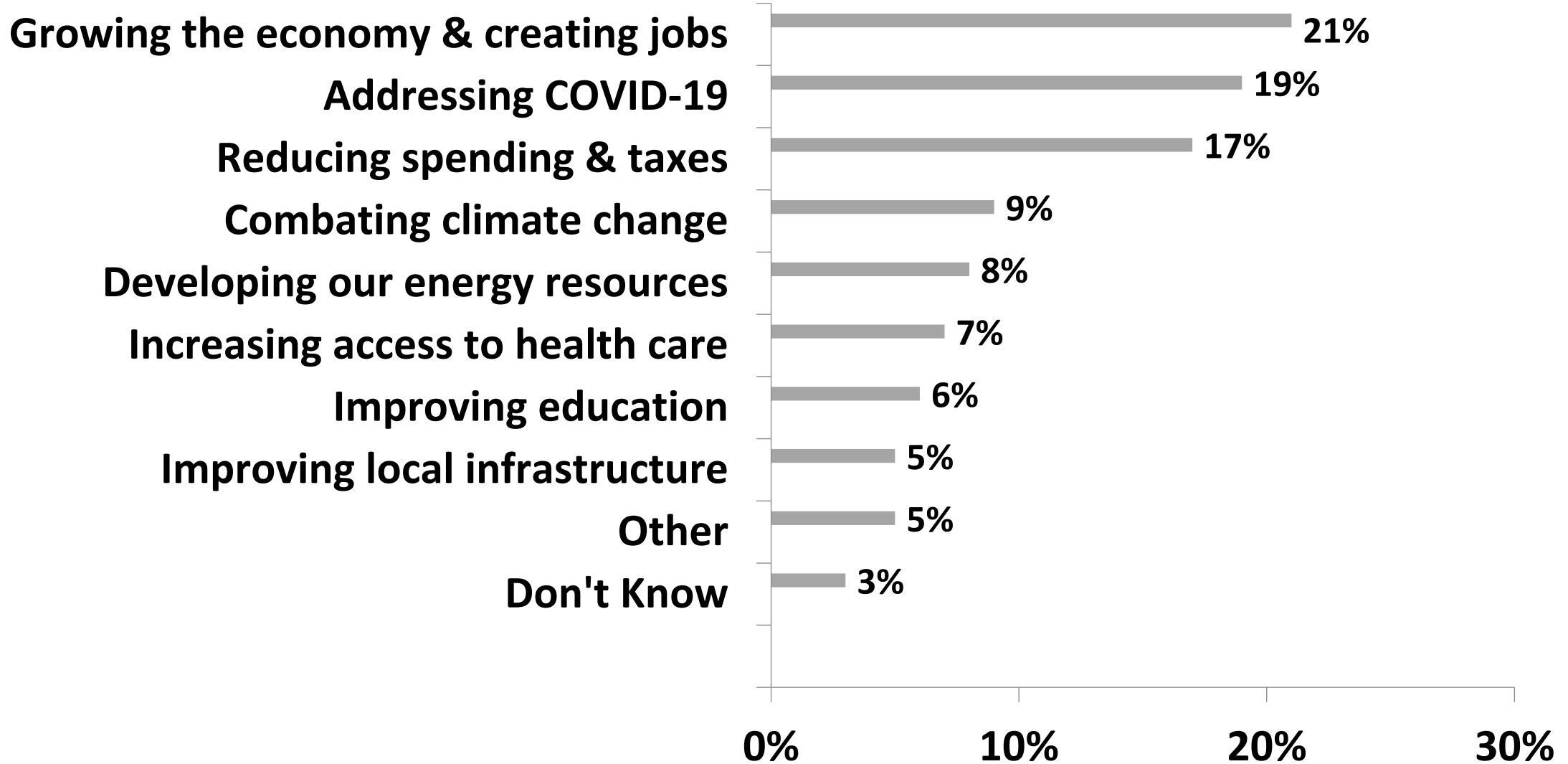
- Is Montana generally headed in the right direction, or would you say things have pretty much gotten off on the wrong track?

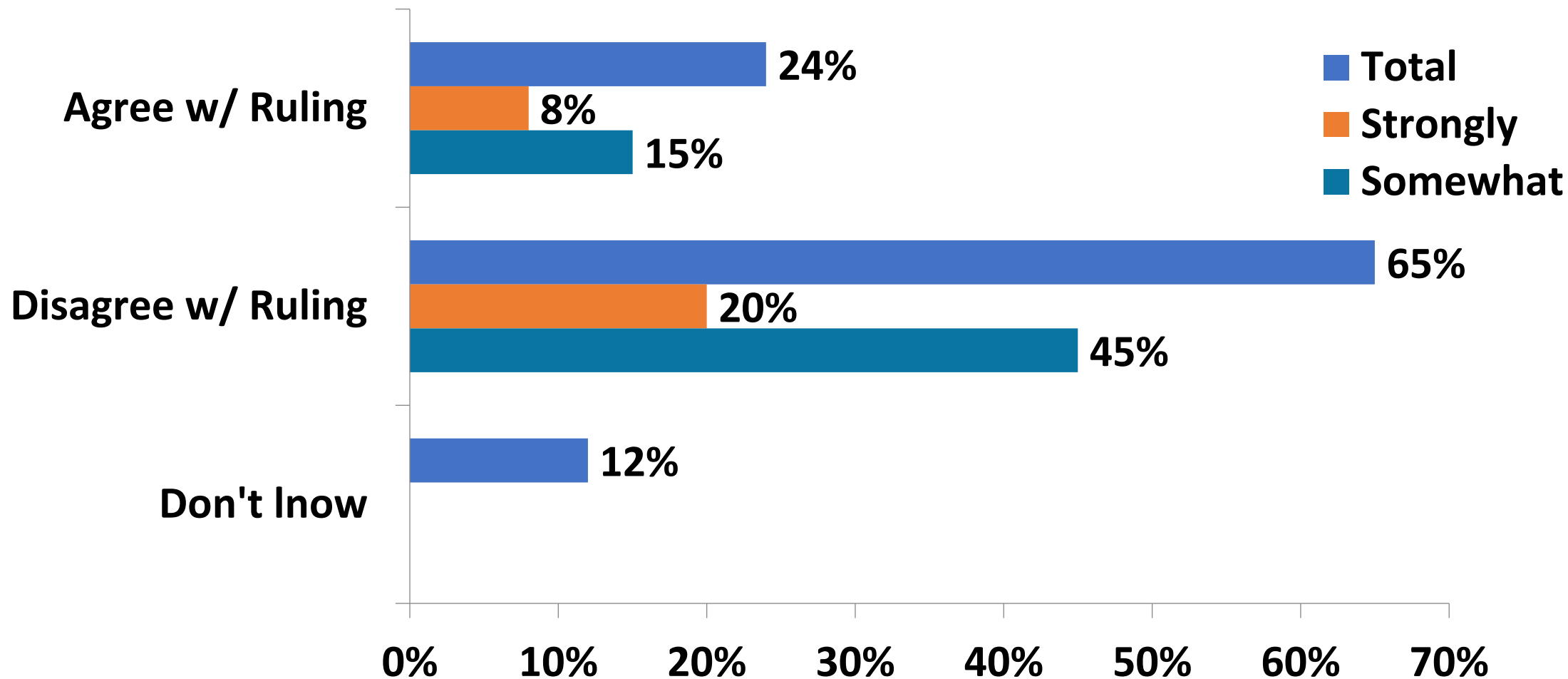


Most Important Issue
